



Campsite Numbers

If you have discovered a number plate in your front yard, it is because the number we placed on your electric pedestal is not visible from the campground road. Miami County officials have gone to great lengths to make sure each campsite has a number that can be read from the campground road.

If you have one of these ugly number plates in your yard and would like to replace it with one that is a bit more appealing to the eye, here is the Miami County Health Department Guidelines:

"Each site shall be marked so as to be readily identifiable and easily readable from the campground road. Each site shall be identified in numerals, letters or combination thereof, in sequential order. Of at least two inches in size and posted at least six inches above the ground."

If you would like an example of the "Government Approved" numbering of sites, you can look at sites #37 and #335. These campers did it right and didn't even know of any such regulation. Thank you all for complying with the Government mandated site number requirements. I will keep you posted on any further mandates or orders from our elected officials.
