2022 Price Increase for Seasonal Campers

Since the beginning of this year, costs have increased on, well... everything. You can thank our "so called" government leaders, COVID, China, or whoever you think is the main culprit, but that doesn't change that fact that with increased prices comes increased prices. Your Poor Farmer's team has put their heads together to figure out the least amount of increase needed to continue to keep our doors swinging. In the end of all that thinking, the result is an increase of \$150.00/year or \$12.50/month if you break it down. Check out the comparison below.

2021 rates:

\$1200.00/camping season

Early pay discounts:

Before Feb 15th: \$850.00 (\$350.00 discount) Before Mar 15th: \$900.00 (\$300.00 discount) Before Apr 15th: \$950.00 (\$250.00 discount)

2022 rates:

\$1500.00/Camping season

Early Payment discounts:

Before Feb 15th: \$1000.00 (\$500.00 discount) Before Mar 15th: \$1100.00 (\$400.00 discount) Before Apr 15th: \$1200.00 (\$300.00 discount)

*The rate for new Seasonal Campers will be \$1500.00.
