Backflow Preventors/ Vacuum Breakers

Miami County Health Code dictates that all campsites must have a vacuum breaker, or as we call them, backflow preventers, on every spicket. These vacuum breakers prevent water from backflowing from your camper back into the system.

Yes, I know that campers already have check valves on their city water hook-up and I also know that these "backflow preventers" spray water everywhere. Even though they are annoying, like the BMV, the government has to have them. So they are not only "Backflow

Preventers"... they are also Health Department Fine Preventers.

So please, please, please make sure that these little gizmos stay on your spicket. If we see that yours has been removed, you may incur a fine of your own. Thank you for your continued support of our regulations and the regulations of our county government.





Every camper that brings a golf cart onto the property is required to carry insurance on that vehicle. That insurance paperwork must be on file with our administrative department. Once on file, you will be given a golf cart pass to display on your buggy so we know you have the insurance. As simple as this process sounds, we have over 50 campers who do not have a current insurance card on file with Amy. Those of you who do not have a golf cart pass for the 2022 season need to get your insurance info to amy@poorfarmerrvs.com so we can have your info on file and make you a golf cart pass. 
Thanks to everyone who participated. We even got the event founder, Rick LeVally out there for a photo op. Just kidding, we put his butt to work. Thanks Rick!




