Rate Increase for Monthly Camping

Due to increased costs all around, we are forced to increase our monthly camping rate from 375.00 to 450.00. We have experienced increases in every aspect of our overhead. This new rate will be effective on January 1st of 2023 for all new campers.

The required move in rate, as of 1/1/23, will be as follows:

One month rent (\$450.00) + One month deposit (\$450.00) + Electric deposit (\$100.00) = \$1000.00 move in cost with \$550.00 of deposits returned to you when you leave, providing all the bills are paid.

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
