

The Spring Tractor Show & Flea Market is one of the biggest weekends we will have at Poor Farmer's. Every campsite is reserved, and calls have been coming in for months about flea spots. It looks to be a very nice weekend... if the weather cooperates.

Flea spots will be available to rent Monday, June 2nd. If you have a campsite reserved and wish to flea at your site, you can register and pay the \$50 when you check-in. Remember that any vendor still open and selling at 2pm on Sunday, June 8th will receive a \$10 refund from their flea market payment.

These items are not permitted to be sold at the flea market:

- Food and drink (Only licensed concessionaires are permitted to do so)
- RVs & Automobiles
- Illegal or controlled substances
- Weapons which require an FFL to own (Please remember that all weapons should be unloaded and cable locked)

Some other things to remember:

- The speed limit is 5mph through the entire campground
- The dumpsters are for household trash only. No large items or leftover inventory
- No shopping from your vehicle. We allow golf carts and handicap scooters for those who need them.
- If you do not have a pass for camping, you will be required to park in the public parking as you come into the grounds.

This Tractor Show is 50 years old and still going strong. We hope to keep the tradition going as long as possible. We would like to thank all the campers, flea marketeers, shoppers, tractor pullers, exhibitors, and concessions for their years of participation and help with making this event a staple in our community.

Some Rules to Keep in Mind

There are two types of campers, those who follow the rules, and those who don't. This article is for everyone, but I would like the campers who don't follow the rules to really pay attention to this. As with any establishment, you must have rules. Rules keep everything on an even keel. Without them, we would have complete chaos. Although all the rules are very important. Here are some commonly ignored rules that I would like you to remember.

- 1.) **-Rule No.19-** No outside vendors or repair services are permitted in the campground without prior permission from the General Manager.
- 2.) **-Rule No.22-** Dining fly canopies, screen enclosers, and tents must be taken down Sunday evening before going home. No permanent dining flies, canopies or screen enclosures will be allowed.
- 3.) -Rule No.13- Please bring your trash up to the dumpster before leaving the campground. The dumpsters are for household trash only. Please do not dump any large items (i.e. outside carpets, furniture, tires, appliances, mattresses, etc.)
- 4.) **-Rule No.3-** All adult guests must be registered and pay before the night of their stay. Live-in guests must file an admission agreement and pass a background check.

As I said, all 27 rules are important, but these have been overlooked by a few. Thank you for following the rules. They are there to keep our campground beautiful, orderly and most of all... affordable. As always, make sure you comply with the most important rule of them all... **-Rule No. 27**- Relax and have a great time!
