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

2025 Review



HAPPY 250T TO ALL MY FELLOW LEATHERNECKS? SEMPER FI!

On November 10th of this year millions of Marines, and Marine Corps veterans will turn 250 years old. You see, when you graduate from Marine Corps bootcamp, you are not only given the title of Marine, but you are also given another birthday. On November 10th, 1775, a committee of the Continental Congress met at Tun Tavern in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to approve a resolution drafted by John Adams, calling for the creation of two battalions of Marines to support the newly formed Continental Navy. Tun Tavern became the first recruiting station, and the first Commandant of the Marine Corps was Major Samuel Nichols. His first point of order was to commission Robert Mullen, the owner of the Tun Tavern and fellow patriot, to the rank of Captain for his duties as the first Marine Corps recruiter. Every year, Marines around the world celebrate the birth of our beloved Corps with a Marine Corps Ball. We would break out the dress blues, shine our EGAs, and make sure we had enough cash to cover the bar. Privates and PFCs would celebrate side by side with Colonels and Generals as brotherhood took precedence over anything else. By the end of the night, usually all that was left standing were the young non-NCOs and a couple hard charging staff-NCOs trying to finish what's left of the liquor. I was in the Corps for the 219th - 222nd birthdays. We would eat, recognize the youngest and oldest Marines in the place, listen to a speech from the Commandant, then we would drink and be merry. The next day all your left with is a hangover, a uniform cleaning bill, and the hopes that your CO won't call you into his office for something you don't even remember doing.

There are Marines around the world who will celebrate our birthday on November 10th. Some will be at home with their families, some will be celebrating in a combat zone with their rifle, and the lucky ones will be with their brothers. I will be one of the lucky ones, as one Marine brother will be driving up from Tennessee to join me in a road trip out to see our brother in New Jersey. What a grand ole' time we will have turning 250 years old. At the end of April in 2026, I will be hosting an even larger group of Marines who served at MCAS Tustin. Last year we had 23 of my brothers and sisters from all over America join in for the second annual Tustin PMO Reunion.

The 2026 reunion seems to be growing even larger than that. I already have 26 Marines on the roster for next year. With all these Marines invading our shores, they will need a place to lay their head. Here is where you can help. If you are not using your camper during the weekend of April 24th, 25th, & 26th, and wish to have a Marine and possibly their spouse stay in your coach for the weekend, it would be greatly appreciated. Let me know if you are interested

To all my Marine brothers and sisters out there. I hope you enjoy our 250th birthday. Please stay safe, be merry and Happy Birthday! From Tun Tavern to MCAS Tustin, Marines can do only one thing better than killing... and that's celebrating. Uh Rah, Semper Fidelus, and God Bless all the Devil Dogs.

Polar Farmer's As the camping season draws to a close, the campers who remain prepare for their winter stay. For the veterans, it's nothing

As the camping season draws to a close, the campers who remain prepare for their winter stay. For the veterans, it's nothing they haven't done before. Whether they move their coach to a different site or baton down the hatches where they are, at this point they are either very prepared or have already finished. The first timers, however, are going to have some questions. Here are some frequently asked questions that you may be seeking answers too:

When do you turn the water off?

Answer: We try to keep the water on as long as we can without risking freezing the spickets sticking out of the ground. We will give as much warning on Facebook when we make the decision.

What can we use to insulate around our camper?

Answer: You are permitted to use insulation board, treated plywood, or aftermarket skirting to insulate your underbelly. Please make sure you skirting is secure so the wind does not blow it all over the campground.

• How do I get a 100lbs propane tank?

Answer: You can call or go into the parts store and request a 100lbs tank. There is no charge to rent the tank, you must pay for the propane and any LP hose you may need for that tank before we will deliver it.

Some other things to remember:

- Ultimate RVS is here to help in case you have any issues with your camper. They can usually come down to your campsite and make the needed repairs there.
- Our Parts Store hours for the winter months are as follows:
 Monday thru Friday 8am to 5pm until March 1st. Closed from 12pm 1pm for lunch. Check with the parts store for our holiday hours as well.
- Please do not park your vehicle in a spot that is going to leave ruts. Park along the road (as long as traffic can get by) or on your gravel pad. Let us know if you are unsure of where to park.
- The heated shower house will remain open all winter and the spicket on the North side will be on. There is a hose just inside the Men's restroom door. Please take care of it and put it back where it goes when finished.
- When snow falls, we will get the roads plowed. Please make sure there is nothing that will get in the way of this.

If you have further questions, just ask us and we will help you the best we can. As always, the speed limit in the campground is 5MPH and all the rules and regulations still apply... except that one about mowing... that one has been rendered moot due to the grass not growing.

Keep your propane filled and your camper warm as we head into colder temperatures day by day. Watching the frost line on your hundred pounders, that will help tell you where the level is, but keep your smaller tanks filled for a backup. Take care of our shower houses, they get cleaned daily, but please clean up any messes you make. Thank you and I hope you all have a great winter.
